

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

PART I: OLD TESTAMENT

Chapter 1: Creation Out of Nothing (Genesis 1:1-3)



"God can take a life that is hopeless, empty, or broken and transform it into something beautiful for His glory."

hen we ascribe creation to man, it is essential to recognize that we cannot equate what God did with what man does. Human inventions have dominated history in every age.

From the time Adam named God's creation in Eden to the present day, humanity has made incredible advancements in civilization, including groundbreaking technological developments.

However, when the Bible says in Genesis that God created the heavens and the earth, everything in it, and made man from the dust of the ground, it is the most profound act of creation. While man has raw materials and often draws from existing inventions to add value, what God did in Genesis 1 was entirely SUPERNATURAL. No human can ever replicate that!

In theology, scholars describe this act of God as creation 'ex nihilo'—meaning "out of nothing." Unlike humans who are inspired by external sources, God has no inspiration from anyone or anything. He does not need encouragement or assistance from others.

Just as the earth was void, empty, and shrouded in darkness, God created the heavens and the earth, filling them and declaring everything was "VERY GOOD" (Genesis 1:31). Similarly, He can take a life that is hopeless, empty, or broken and transform it into something beautiful for His glory. He can take a financially broke person and make him rich. He can take an inexperienced person and make him great.

Paul the Apostle captures this truth in 2 Corinthians 4:7 (NKJV):

"But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellence of the power may be of God and not of us."

From this, we learn that creation was a supernatural act of God. He sustains all things by the word of His power (Hebrews 1:3), and He can bring forth possibilities from situations that seem impossible, just as He created something from nothing.

What can God not do? What challenge in your life is too great for Him to overcome? Present your situation to Him, and watch His mighty power work on your behalf, turning your circumstances around for His glory.

Chapter 2: Sarah Conceiving in Old Age (Genesis 21:1-2)



"God is not bound by human limitations."

ave you ever heard the news of a woman in her 20s, 30s, or 40s giving birth? Of course, you have—it's completely natural and biologically expected. That's why such news doesn't make headlines.

But what if you heard that a 90-year-old woman had given birth, with her 100-year-old husband by her side? That would be nothing short of astonishing, worthy of a Guinness World Record. It would defy logic, break scientific barriers, and leave the world in awe.

The story of Sarah in the Bible is precisely that—a miraculous event that defied all human understanding. God had promised Abraham that he would become the father of many nations, yet he and Sarah remained childless for years. Abraham was fertile, but Sarah was barren.

Then, at an age when childbirth seemed impossible, God reaffirmed His promise:

Genesis 18:10-12 (NKJV) says,

"[10] And He said, 'I will certainly return to you according to the time of life, and behold, Sarah your wife shall have a son.' (Sarah was listening in the tent door which was behind him.) [11] Now Abraham and Sarah were old, well advanced in age; and Sarah had passed the age of childbearing. [12] Therefore Sarah laughed within herself,

saying, 'After I have grown old, shall I have pleasure, my lord being old also?'"

Sarah laughed at the thought—how could she, an elderly woman, bear a child? Yet God remained faithful to His word. At the appointed time, He fulfilled His promise:

Genesis 21:1-2 (NKJV) says,

"1 And the Lord visited Sarah as He had said, and the Lord did for Sarah as He had spoken. 2 For Sarah conceived and bore Abraham a son in his old age, at the set time of which God had spoken to him."

This account reminds us that God is not bound by human limitations. He is not a man that He should lie, nor does He change His mind. What seems impossible to man is possible with God. Trust in Him, and you will witness His wonders in your life.

Chapter 3: The Parting of the Red Sea (Exodus 14:21-22)



"The same problem that threatens to consume you can become the very testimony of your victory."

hat would you do if you found yourself trapped between two impossible situations with no way of escape? In such moments, people tend to fall into two categories: those who give up and succumb to their circumstances, and those who, despite the pain and uncertainty, find a way to move forward.

The God we serve specializes in making a way where there seems to be none. In Genesis 15, God prophesied to Abraham that his descendants would become slaves in a foreign land but that He would judge that nation and bless His people with great possessions.

This prophecy was fulfilled when Israel settled in Egypt due to famine and later became enslaved. After over 400 years, God raised a deliverer—Moses—to lead His people to the Promised Land.

As they journeyed out of Egypt, after witnessing God's mighty wonders and judgments upon Pharaoh, the Israelites found themselves in a terrifying situation. Pharaoh, driven by anger and regret, pursued them with chariots and a powerful army, determined to destroy them. The Israelites were trapped—before them lay the Red Sea, and behind them, the advancing Egyptian army. There was no visible way of escape.

Fearful and desperate, the people cried out to Moses, who in turn sought God's intervention. But the God who keeps His promises performed a miracle—He parted the Red Sea, creating a dry

path for His people to cross safely. When the Egyptians attempted to follow, the waters came crashing down, drowning Pharaoh's army. The very sea that delivered Israel became the instrument of their enemies' destruction.

Exodus 14:21-22 (NKJV) says,


"21 Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and the Lord caused the sea to go back by a strong east wind all that night, and made the sea into dry land, and the waters were divided. 22 So the children of Israel went into the midst of the sea on the dry ground, and the waters were a wall to them on their right hand and on their left."

What Red Sea are you facing today? What problems seem insurmountable, leaving you without an escape? Like Moses, turn to God in prayer and trust in His power to deliver.

The apostle Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians 10:13 that no trial is beyond God's ability to provide a way out. There is no human situation too complex or impossible for God to resolve. Trust in Him, and you will see His salvation. **The same problem that**

Chapter 4: Water from a Rock (Exodus 17:5-6)

ccording to Abraham Maslow's hierarchy of needs, food, water, and shelter are the most basic necessities of life. Without them, a person cannot aspire to fulfill higher needs.

Even in today's world, the lack of food and water continues to claim lives, not just in developing nations but even in some parts of developed countries. Many people struggle to access these essentials and, without them, survival becomes impossible.

On their journey to the Promised Land, the Israelites—who had grown from a small family of 70 people into a vast nation of millions—faced this dire reality. Under the leadership of Moses, they traveled through the wilderness, encountering many challenges. One of the most critical moments came when they ran out of water.

Instead of seeking God's help, the people complained bitterly against Moses, as though he had the power to produce water in the desert. But Moses, as always, turned to God. This is why he remains one of the greatest models of prayer—he trusted God with everything.

Philippians 4:6 (NKJV) reminds us:

"Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God."

In response to Moses' prayer, God gave a miraculous solution: He instructed Moses to strike

a rock with his staff, and from that rock, water would flow abundantly. Moses obeyed, and just as God had promised, water gushed out, providing for the entire nation.

Exodus 17:5-6 (NKJV)

"5 And the Lord said to Moses, 'Go on before the people, and take with you some of the elders of Israel. Also take in your hand your rod with which you struck the river, and go. 6 Behold, I will stand before you there on the rock in Horeb; and you shall strike the rock, and water will come out of it, that the people may drink.' And Moses did so in the sight of the elders of Israel."

This story is a powerful reminder that God is our ultimate provider. Just as He provided water for Israel in their time of need, He can supply whatever we lack—physically, emotionally, or spiritually.

Psalm 23 beautifully captures this assurance:

"He makes me lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside still waters."

What is your greatest need today? Instead of complaining, follow Moses' example—turn your

needs into prayers. Wrestle with God in faith until you receive your breakthrough, for every good and perfect gift comes from Him alone.

Chapter 5: Manna from Heaven (Exodus 16:4, 14-15)

global hunger is a silent killer, claiming more lives than wars. This crisis is especially heartbreaking in African nations, where abundant natural resources and fertile lands exist, yet mismanagement has led to untold deaths—deaths that could have been prevented.

But imagine a situation even worse: the Israelites journeying through the wilderness, where no

resources existed, no farmlands to cultivate, and no food markets to buy from. Even if they had all the money in the world, it wouldn't have helped them in a place where food simply did not exist.

What do you do when you have a need that money, influence, or effort cannot solve? A man in the desert with billions of dollars is still a hungry man—no amount of advice or encouragement can ease his hunger. A hungry man is an angry man, and this was exactly Israel's response.

Once again, Moses turned to God. He understood that only God could provide in such a desperate situation. But what's heartbreaking in this story is that Israel failed to trust God despite all the mighty works He had already done for them—from Egypt to the Red Sea and even in the wilderness. Instead of believing, they complained and threatened Moses, allowing doubt and fear to take over.

Exodus 16:4 (NKJV)

"Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Behold, I will rain bread from heaven for you. And the people shall go out and gather a certain quota every day, that I may test them, whether they will walk in My law or not.'"

God did the impossible: He provided bread in the morning and meat in the evening. Where did He get these supplies from? From nowhere—because our God creates out of nothing. Before Israel even left Egypt, God had already made provisions for their journey. They only had to trust Him instead of complaining.

God was not surprised by their hunger, but they were surprised by His provision.

The gospel singer Nathaniel Bassey beautifully captures this in his song: "This God is too good."

Yes, He is! If God could provide water, bread, and meat for millions in the wilderness, don't you think He can provide for you and your family? Your needs are not too difficult for Him to meet.

Philippians 4:19 (NKJV) says,

"And my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Iesus."

So, what is your greatest need today? Instead of worrying or complaining, trust in God's ability to provide—He is the same yesterday, today, and forever!

PART II: NEW TESTAMENT

Chapter 6: The Virgin Birth of Jesus (Luke 1:26-38)



"Just because something has never been done before does not mean God cannot make it happen."

hroughout history, human birth has followed a natural order—a man and a woman come together to conceive and bring forth offspring. This has been God's design since creation. However, the same God who formed humanity from the dust of the earth is not bound by the natural laws He established. When it suits His divine purpose, He can interrupt the natural order to fulfill His will.

The story of Mary, a virgin living in ancient Israel, is a remarkable demonstration of God's supernatural power. No one could have imagined that a woman would conceive and give birth without the involvement of a man. Yet, this is exactly what happened.

Historically, Mary was a young teenager, betrothed to Joseph, a righteous man and a carpenter. One day, an angel of the Lord appeared to her with an astonishing message—she would conceive and give birth to the Saviour of the world. Understandably, she was confused and asked how this could happen, given that she was a virgin.

Luke 1:35 (NKJV) says,

"And the angel answered and said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you; therefore, also, that Holy One who is to be born will be called the Son of God.'"

God, who never fails to fulfill His promises, did exactly as He said. Mary conceived through the power of the Holy Spirit and gave birth to Jesus Christ, the Saviour of the world. The angel's words to Mary serve as a powerful reminder of God's limitless ability:

"For with God nothing will be impossible." - Luke 1:37 (NKJV)

There is nothing God cannot do. He is not restricted by the natural laws of life—He created those laws and can override them whenever He pleases. While humans believe conception is only possible through natural means, God proves that He is not bound by His own order. He can disrupt it and still accomplish His divine plans.

The virgin birth teaches us a fundamental truth: nothing is impossible with God. Just because something has never been done before does not mean God cannot make it happen.

Mary's response of faith is an example for all believers. Despite the impossibility of the situation, she humbly submitted to God's will, saying:

"Let it be to me according to your word." - Luke 1:38 (NKJV)

May we also learn to trust God without hesitation, believing that He can turn the impossible into reality in our lives!

Chapter 7: Water Turned into Wine (John 2:1-11)

he process of wine production follows a specific sequence—fermentation, aging, and refinement—to achieve the desired flavor. If any step is missed or altered, the final product will not meet expectations. Similarly, the right ingredients must be carefully assembled to produce the best quality wine.

However, life does not always follow predictable processes. What is written and practiced is not the only way to achieve results. God's kingdom operates beyond earthly limitations. He is not bound by human methods or restricted by natural laws.

The story of Jesus turning water into wine at Cana is a powerful demonstration of God's supernatural ability. At a wedding where Jesus and His family were invited, the wine supply unexpectedly ran out. As you know, weddings are joyous occasions, and guests expect to eat, drink, and celebrate. Running out of wine would have been an embarrassment for the hosts.

Recognizing the situation, Mary, Jesus' mother, approached Him, knowing what He was capable of. She requested that He intervene, but Jesus initially responded that His time had not yet come. Yet, moments later, He instructed the servants to fill empty barrels with water and begin serving. To their astonishment, the water had been miraculously transformed into the finest wine, far superior to what had been originally served.

How did Jesus turn ordinary, tasteless water into exquisite wine in an instant, without following the human process of wine production? The answer is simple: Jesus operates beyond human limitations.

Hebrews 11:3 (NKJV) says,

"By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible."

What is unseen gives birth to what is seen. Jesus could not be restricted by human methods for producing wine. When He decides to act, nothing can obstruct Him. He is Lord over all things, including wine.

This miracle also reminds us of a similar event in Exodus 15:23-25, when God turned bitter water into sweet water for the Israelites in the wilderness. Just as He provided for them, He is capable of transforming our bitter experiences into sweet testimonies that glorify His name.

No situation is too difficult for God. What seems impossible to man is effortless for Him. The next

time you face a crisis, remember this miracle—God can turn lack into abundance, bitterness into sweetness, and shame into honor.

Chapter 8: The Healing of the Nobleman's Son (John 4:46-54)



"God's power is not restricted by space or time."

Their natural response is to seek medical attention. Doctors examine, diagnose, and prescribe medication to manage or cure illnesses. This is because God has given wisdom to medical professionals to care for the sick.

However, one undeniable truth about life is that not every sickness can be cured by medicine. When a case is beyond the expertise of doctors, they can only offer palliative care until the inevitable happens. This reality reminds us that doctors are not God—they have limits.

For wealthy individuals, access to the best medical care is not an issue. They can afford the finest treatment and the most skilled specialists, yet even the best resources cannot guarantee healing. This was the situation of the nobleman in John 4:46-54. He had probably tried everything—the best physicians, the most expensive treatments—but his son remained gravely ill. Realizing that human effort had failed, he turned to Jesus, knowing what He had done before.

When the nobleman approached Jesus, requesting Him to heal his son, Jesus initially suggested that He would come to his home. However, the nobleman, recognizing the authority of Jesus, responded with a remarkable statement of faith. He understood authority in the natural sense—just as he, a man of rank, could give orders and be obeyed, Jesus' words carried even greater authority.

Rather than insisting that Jesus physically visit his home, the nobleman believed in the power of His word. Jesus simply spoke, and at that very moment, his son was healed. When the nobleman later inquired about the exact time of his son's recovery, he discovered that it happened the very moment Jesus spoke.

This miracle demonstrates the unlimited power of Jesus. Unlike other healings where He laid hands on the sick, this time He healed from a distance, proving that God's power is not restricted by space or time.

Psalm 107:20 (NKJV) says,

"He sent His word and healed them, and delivered them from their destructions."

The same creative power that formed the heavens and the earth by His word (Genesis 1) is the same power that heals, restores, and sustains all things. If His word upholds the entire universe, what can't He do with His word?

Jesus healed the nobleman's son simply by speaking the word. This teaches us that **God does**

not always need a process to bring healing or breakthrough—His word alone is enough. When we put our faith in God and trust His word, we position ourselves to receive the miraculous.

Whatever seems impossible in your life today, remember that His word is living, active, and powerful. One word from Him can change everything!

Chapter 9: A Great Catch of Fish After a Fruitless Night (Luke 5:4-7)

an the Son of a carpenter teach experienced fishermen how to catch fish? Fishing is a skill refined through years of experience, requiring knowledge of timing, weather patterns, and the right locations for a great harvest. Seasoned fishermen, like Peter and his partners, knew these principles well.

On this particular day, Peter and his companions had toiled all night without success. Despite their skill and effort, they caught nothing. Exhausted and discouraged, they washed their nets, ready to call it a day.

Then, Jesus appeared. He asked to use their boat as a pulpit to preach to the crowd. After delivering His message, He turned to Peter and gave an unexpected instruction:

"Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." (Luke 5:4)

At first, Peter hesitated, knowing that all their experience had shown that there were no fish. But then, he said:

"Nevertheless, at Your word, I will let down the net."

The result? A miraculous catch—so great that their nets began to break, and they had to call for help to haul in the overwhelming harvest.

This moment revealed a profound truth: success is not solely based on human wisdom, skill, or effort. Peter and his team had expertise, yet they caught nothing. But at Jesus' word, they received a supernatural harvest.

That is on land—but what happens when a violent storm strikes while you are at sea, with nowhere to escape?

This is exactly what happened to Jesus' disciples as they traveled with Him across the sea. Jesus was asleep in the boat when a fierce storm arose, threatening to sink them. Even among them, seasoned fishermen—who had spent their lives on the water—could do nothing to stop it. They were terrified and felt completely powerless.

Then, they remembered that Jesus was in the boat. In their desperation, they woke Him up and pleaded for help. They had no idea what He would do, but then, Jesus rose, rebuked the wind, and commanded the sea to be still. Instantly, there was a great calm.

The disciples were astonished. They had walked with Him, seen His miracles, and listened to His teachings—but they never expected this. They asked among themselves:

"Who can this be, that even the wind and the sea obey Him?" (Mark 4:41)

The storm obeyed the voice of its Creator. The sea and wind were subject to Him, for He had made them. They could not rebel against the One who spoke them into existence.

This miracle teaches us a powerful truth: no storm is beyond Jesus' control.

Whatever storm you are facing today, surrender it to Jesus. Trust Him—and watch Him bring peace.



In embracing this truth daily—believing in His limitless potential—you'll find strength in knowing that no matter what lies ahead, "the Lord will fulfill


his purpose for me; your steadfast love endures forever—do not forsake the work of your hands" (Psalm 138:8).
